## **GOLF FORMAT**

We play a "SCRAMBLE" competition between foursomes. Select the best drive and pick up the other balls. Each player hits their second shot from the location of the best drive. Procedure is repeated on every shot, including putting, until your foursome holes out. Each member of the foursomes' tee-shot must be used at least three times. Each foursome has only one score per hole, with a double-bogey maximum score per hole.

**Prizes awarded for 20<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 1<sup>st</sup> place low gross for each individual of these winning foursomes.**

## **RULES - TEE SHOTS & DOUBLE BOGEY**

Winter rules apply. Each member of the foursome's tee-shot must be used at least three times. **No more than a double bogey score per hole.** Rake traps, repair ball marks on greens and replace divots. Shirts with collars must be worn at all times. Men tee-off from the white tee markers; women tee-off from the red. Distance markers are in the fairways and on sprinkler heads. Please keep carts on the cart paths, away from greens, tees and roped off areas.

## **AFTER GOLF - TURN IN SCORECARD & RECEPTION**

After 18 holes, immediately turn in your scorecard to the pro shop staff, so scores can be posted and tallied for prizes. We will not wait for those not turning in scorecards. Do not play any additional holes or you will be disqualified. After turning in your scorecard, meet at the putting green for our Reception and Putt-Off playoff.

## **RANGE USE & GOLF CART KEYS**

Driving range will be open all day. Range balls are available at the range. No woods can be used. **Golf cart keys given out at 12:25 PM.**
